Who is Eligible?

Each team will be made up of two youth members and one adult. Youth must be current members of either 4-H or FFA to participate. 3rd through 12th grade youth are eligible. The adult must be over 18 years old, and not a current 4-H or FFA member.

Contest Fees: \$30 per team (Max 10 teams). Paid to Harrison County Cattlemen's Association. Registration Open May 1, 2018. Entry Deadline: 6:00 pm, Friday, June 15th.

Please sign up with Miranda Edge, ANR Extension Educator, at the Extension Office before the fair or with Thomas Owen, President of Cattlemen's Association from 4-6 pm on Friday, June 15th at the Cattlemen's Association Tent/Grilling area. Entries may be closed at the discretion of the Cattlemen's Association Contest Committee.

An equipment practice will be held in the 4-H Show Pavilion as soon as available, Saturday, June 16th for anyone who has not used a tub and chute before.

Contest Rules

- 1. Each team will be required to work three head of cattle (approx. 200-600 lb) from a holding pen into a working chute and properly capture each animal's neck in the head gate. After the animal is caught, all the instructed health management products and practices will be administered by the team.
- 2. Each team will be responsible for the preparation of each product; for example:
 - a. Loading syringes
 - b. Loading ear tagger
 - c. Preparing pour-on
 - d. Preparing drench
 - e. Specific products will be announced at the contest
- 3. Only equipment provided by the Cattlemen's Association Contest Committee will be allowed.
- 4. Each team will be timed to see who can complete their tasks properly on three head of cattle in the least amount of time.
- 5. Penalty times can be assigned as follows:
 - a. Improper application or administration of a product 10 seconds
 - b. Failure to apply or administer a product 30 seconds
 - c. Unusually rough or harsh treatment of an animal 30 seconds
 - d. Use of any equipment other than that which is provided by the committee 3 minutes
 - e. Failure to catch a calf resulting in it escaping through the chute without being stopped team disqualification
 - f. A calf caught in the head gate other than at the neck must be released and re-caught properly at the neck. Failure to do this will result in team disqualification.
- 6. Disqualification will result if the judges agree that total processing is unsatisfactory or that a potentially dangerous situation exists
- 7. The decision of the judges is final
- 8. All rules will be addressed before the contest.
